Introduction

Welcome to this 30-day devotional journey! I'm so glad you're here. This devotional is built around the S.O.A.P. method, a simple and powerful way to study Scripture that helps you connect with God's Word on a deeper level. While I, Kristiann, didn't create this method myself, it's made a huge difference in how I read and understand the Bible. When I began studying for myself, S.O.A.P. gave me structure, focus, and clarity—and now, I'm excited to pass that gift on to you. The spiritual journey we will be embarking on is tailored around exploring the loving character of God, and how that informs who we are in Him. We were created by love for love. Because we are loved, we can live freely in Christ and share HIs love with others.

What is the S.O.A.P. Method? S.O.A.P. stands for:

- S Scripture: Write out the verse or passage that stands out to you.
- O Observation: Take note of what you see in the text. What's happening? Who's speaking? What is the immediate context? What do the words and grammar mean?
- A Application: Ask how this verse applies to your life. What is God saying to you personally? How can you respond?
- P Prayer: Write a simple prayer based on what you've read. Invite God to help you apply these lessons to your life.

This method allows you to slow down, reflect, and make space to hear God speak through His Word.

To help guide your time, I've included:

- **Application prompts** and reflection questions for deeper understanding
- A "Wrap-Up with Kris" section where I share a guided summary of the scriptures
- A daily song suggestion—because music is such a meaningful part of how I connect with God. Feel free to listen to the songs I've shared or add your own that speak to your heart that day.

I pray this devotional helps you see Jesus more clearly, one scripture at a time.

Let's begin.

GODIS LOVE

Scripture:

'He who does not love does not know God, for God is love." 1 John 4:8

"'Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away.'

Observation:

What three things did you notice about these verses?

Did you realize that the aspects of love are action words?

Mention this is the application.

God's love for us is more than a feeling.

God is the embodiment of every aspect of love.

Love is the foundation of every action God makes towards us. In our lives, we need to ask the Holy Spirit to open our eyes to ways God shows us love, beyond what we are used to. In our relationships with those around us, we have the responsibility to love them in this way.

It is not always easy to love others as scripture calls us too, but we must again, ask the Holy Spirit to guide us.

Love is more than just a feeling. Love is an action word.

Prayer:

Ask God to help you see more of His love towards you.

Ask the Holy Spirit to give you the strength to love others as the Bible calls us to.

DAY 2 ALL THINGS NEW

Scripture:

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

2 Corinthians 5:17

Observation:

What are three things you noticed about how the verse is written?

Do you know the significance of "therefore" at the beginning of the verse?

What do you think the old vs. new is referring to?

A relationship with Jesus is meant to change you. It's the best change you'll ever have. It won't always be easy, but God's got you. When God begins to change your heart, you will no longer live according to the sinful ways of the world and your flesh. You will start to live according to the righteousness of God. Stay connected to Jesus and witness a great change!

Prayer:

Ask to God open your heart to the change He wants to bring about in your life. Ask Him to help you trust Him during this journey. It will be difficult at times, and many people won't like the changes you're making, but just know that God will be there for you.

FIRM FOUNDATION

Scripture:

'"Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock: and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it did not fall, for it was founded on the rock. "But it everyone who hears these sayings of Mine, and does not do them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand: and the rain descended, the floods came; and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it fell. And great was its fall."

Matthew 7:24-27NKJV

Observation:

What three things did you notice about these verses?
What do these metaphors represent for you in your personal life?
Why does Jesus compare Himself to rock?
Mention this is the application.

Jesus is a solid rock and a firm foundation. Hearing and doing what Jesus says is the best decision that we could ever make. His words and teachings are designed to help us live a full life that is truthfully dedicated to the love of God and the love of each other. There are people who may not like us because we love Jesus, and that is okay. Jesus is a strong foundation, and His promises are true. The enemy may try to destroy us, but in Jesus name we will not be stopped. We may be physically shaken, but when we are anchored to Jesus, we will not be spiritually shaken.

Prayer:

Ask God to help you anchor yourself in Him. Give Him thanks for always being there for you through any storm you face.

Mention this is the application.

The all-powerful God of the universe only provides good and perfect gifts. Anything bad or evil comes from the Devil (the enemy). The enemy's goal is to steal, kill, and destroy. But the God we serve has far better plans in store for us. He wants to save us, heal us, restore us, and prosper us. And the best thing is, HE NEVER CHANGES. That means that God will forever and always be good, and He will forever and always be good to us. We can go to Him at all times, and He will be there to comfort us and guide us. There is nothing we could ever do to stop God from loving us.

That won't change either!

You may be thinking, "bad things happen in my life, how is it not God, and why do they happen?" (Read James 1:2-4) "I'm tempted, I thought it was God who tempted me?" (Read James 1:12-17)

Prayer:

Thank God for all the good things you have in your life and

thank Him for never changing.

FREE INDEED

Scripture:

"Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed."

John 8:36

Observation:

What three things did you notice about these verses?

There's that "therefore" again, what does that mean for this verse?

The word "indeed" adds a great deal of certainty, what does that mean for this verse?

Who is the Son?

Mention this is the application.

Application:

In these verses, Jesus was speaking to a few Jews who believed Him, but still had questions. They didn't understand what it meant to be spiritually bound to sin, so they didn't know what Jesus meant when He said the truth would make them free (vs 32). Jesus was emphasizing to them, and to us, that sin makes us slaves. Habitually sinning and walking away from God is enslavement; our minds are not free to worship God. Our actions are bound by the urge to do evil and move away from the goodness of God. That is not the lifestyle that God has in store for us. So, Jesus says that if we believe in Him, we will be set free from the power and grasp of sin. In Jesus' name sin will no longer chain us or have dominion over us.

In Jesus, we have the power to say no to sin and say yes to pursuing a life with Christ!

Prayer:

DAY 6 IMPOSIBILITIES MADE POSSIBLE

Scripture:

'But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

Matthew 19:26

Observation:

What three things did you notice about these verses?

Why do you think Jesus used the comparison of relationships: with men and with God?

Note: Jesus is responding to a simple response to a question,

go back and read the question.

How does the word "all" affect your understanding of this verse?

In the context of this verse, the disciples were shocked that Jesus said that it would be easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than it would be for a rich man to go to heaven. Jesus isn't saying that money is bad, He's saying that the love of money is bad. According to the Amplified version of the Bible, during that time, the Pharisees preached that those who were rich were God's chosen people and that they would automatically go to heaven. The disciples were shocked and confused because based on what they had heard, if rich folk couldn't make it, then, who could?! But Jesus responded that with God all things were possible. Jesus simply stated that to make it to heaven, us humans need to rely on God, not our own riches and resources. Since this verse uses the word all, we can apply this to every aspect of our lives. Relying on God is the most secure thing we could ever do. We may not know what will happen next, but God will always make a way. Trust in God, follow His will for your life, and you will find yourself doing the "impossible".

Prayer:

Ask God to help you trust Him more and to have the utmost confidence in Him.

DAY 7 GOODNESS

Scripture:

'For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the Lord, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope.'

Jeremiah 29:11

Observation:

Did you notice how personal this is? God said "I know the thoughts that I think toward you"

Did you notice how clear God was in His intentions?

What does this say about God's character?

Mention in the application

Application:

everything we want. However, It does mean that everything that God provides for us is for our good. As simple as it sounds, it's not always easy to believe that, especially when something happened that we did not like. In every situation God is there to comfort and encourage us. In every stage of our lives God plans to help us through. We have hope in Him that even though the situation isn't favorable, the favor of our God still rests upon us. God is for us. He is for our well-being, especially our spiritual well-being. Some situations may test your faith or your patience, but know that your God is rooting for you. Your God is pondering all the plans He has for you, and each one is great!

Prayer:

Thank God for His loving thoughts toward you. Ask Him to help you trust in His plans even more.

Observation:

Mention this in the application.

As believers in Christ, we are called to be different. We are called to stand out. In our generation today, that is the last thing that any of us would rather do, but here Jesus is telling us that that is exactly who we are: different. We are called to show the love of God to others everywhere. In verse 13, as believers in Jesus, we are compared to salt. The purpose of salt is to bring out flavor. Aka, make something taste good. What does it mean to be the taste of the earth? That means that in the name of Jesus, we are called to give this earth place a good taste. It is our calling to go out every day and enhance our surroundings. It's our job to care for our environment, help someone have a better day, and reflect the goodness of God. As a result, God will be praised, like it says in verse 16. What is the purpose of light? To illuminate. Light and darkness cannot exist in the same place. Jesus asks us not to hide our light. Hiding our light is equivalent to encouraging darkness. Be the light that Jesus has called you to be. It will not always be easy, but the God of the universe will shine His love on you, so don't worry.

Prayer:

	Thank Jesus for being the greatest light ever!! Ask God to help you to shine in all the ways He has called you to.

Scripture:

'And you will seek Me and find Me, when you search for Me with all your heart.'

Jeremiah 29:13

Contextual tea: The people of Israel turned against God and did lots of evil things against Him. So, God allowed for them to be taken away as captives to Babylon as a consequence of turning away from Him. God basically tells them that after the time spent in captivity, God will restore them back to Jerusalem. God is promising to take care of His people and be there for them, even though they disobeyed Him.

Observation:

What three things did you notice about these verses?
In this verse, God is giving a responsibility to His people, what is this responsibility, is it extended to you as well?

Did you notice that this verse has a "cause and effect" structure?

What is the cause and what is the effect?

How does this affect the application of this verse? What does that mean about God?

Mention this in the application.

•	

As the loving father that God is, when we disobey Him, He allows us to deal with the consequences of our misbehavior. Consequences are natural occurrences when something does or does not happen. Within this context, the Israelites were continuously disobeying God and doing evil in His sight. The consequence of their disobedience was not being in God's protection anymore, and God allowed them to be taken away as captives into Babylon. But, this verse follows a promise of restoration(vs.10-11). Even though the people turned away from God, God still promised to restore them. Even better, God promised that when they sought Him with their whole heart, they would find Him. This verse highlights God's grace. Even when we turn away from God, and deal with whatever the consequences may be, He still wants to have a relationship with us! Even during our consequences, our heavenly Father still extends Himself to us. There is no mistake too big for God. God's grace is greater!

Prayer:

Thank God for His grace and forgiveness.

Ask Him to help you to be obedient.

Observation:

Application:	

In this context, Jesus was speaking to a multitude while He was speaking on the mount, In verses 25-34 Jesus is telling them not to worry. I love verse 26 because Jesus implicitly tells us why we shouldn't worry. We should not worry because we are important to our heavenly Father. Jesus is contrasting humans and birds, and He makes it clear that we are of more value than birds. This verse is interesting to me because I don't think that we, as humans, consider that God also provides for animals as well. All of creation is actively sustained by God. There is no animal too small in God's eye. Therefore, if God cares for the ittiest bittiest ant, how much more will He care for those who were created in His image(Genesis 1:26)? You are loved by God. You are seen. You are cared for. Do not worry for anything. Trust in your heavenly Father.

Prayer:

Ask God to help you accept this love and favor. Ask Him to help you not to feel less than you really are.

DAY 12 NOWORRIES

Scripture:

'Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.'

Matthew 6:34

Observation:

There's that therefore word again!! (Go back and read vs 25-34 for context)

Note how Jesus say that "today has its own troubles"

Mention this in the application.

•	Application:

A relationship with God does not guarantee a life without problems. Jesus tells us many times that this life will be difficult(John 16:33), but He also tells us not to worry. We have a big God who sees and cares for us. In Jesus name, a relationship with God guarantees us contact with the One that we can trust in all situations. In verse 33, Jesus tells us to seek first the kingdom of God, and all our needs will be added unto us. God already cares about us. He is already making ways to provide for us, but we need to trust Him. We need to get to know our heavenly Father, so that when we are tempted to let worry take control, we can tell it to "leave" because we know that our God is greater. Take each day as it comes, and remind yourself that the creator of the universe is committed to taking care of you. He has never failed you before, and He never will, so don't worry, just trust.

Prayer:

Ask God to help you trust Him more.

Ask God to help you not worry.

Thank God that He is a firm and solid foundation who will never fail.

TRUSTWORTHY

Scripture:

"God is not a man, that He should lie, Nor a son of man, that He should repent. Has He said, and will He not do? Or has He spoken, and will He not make it good?"

Numbers 23:19

Observation:

Do you notice the questions in the verse?- What effect do they have on the verses?

Do you notice the certainty in these statements?

What is the purpose of comparing God to a human?- what does this mean to you?

Mention this in application.

God is not a human. I know that that may seem like a "duh" type of statement, but it is so important for us to understand. Humans are volatile and constantly changing, but our God is not like that. His love for us will never change. His promises will never pass away. He will never lie to us; His word is always true. Therefore, when God says that He loves us and that He won't leave us, He means it. Humans are the complete opposite. Our feelings are always changing, and many times we say things that we won't be able to fulfill. I thank God that He is not like us. Because God never changes, we can be confident in our relationship with Him. We don't need to doubt God's will and plan for our lives because He has stated that they are all for good. How amazing is it that our God never changes. How amazing is it that Our God's words are never void!

Prayer:

Thank God for His stability. Thank Him for His unchanging ways and His unchanging love. Ask Him to help you trust Him more. P.S. I think "I agree" by Jonathan Nelson fits these verses really well. What song do you think is related to this devotional?

BLESSED AND BLAMELESS

Scripture:

'Blessed are those whose ways are blameless, who walk according to the law of the Lord . '

Psalms 119:1

Observation:

What do you notice about this verse?

Do you notice the cause and effect format of this verse?- What does this mean in a relationship with God?

Do you notice the certainty in this verse? Mention this in the application.

When we walk in the ways of the Lord, we are blessed. Blessed means that the favor and protection of God is on our lives. God's laws and commandments are for our protection, and if we are not obeying and following what God says, then we miss out on the benefits of that safety. Many times we view God's laws as restrictive and controlling, but that is actually not true. God wants to protect us and keep us safe. The laws of God are rooted in His everlasting love for us. Therefore, in Christ, we are blessed. We are taken care of. As we have spoken about before, God's plans for us are always good.

Prayer:

Ask God to help you walk in His way.
Thank God for His favor. Thank God for His blessing and love.

CARED ABOUT

Scripture:

'Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.'

1 Peter 5:7 NIV

Observation:

What three things did you notice about these verses?

Do you notice the length of this verse?- Short and sweet- how does this affect your understanding of this verse?

Did you notice the use of the word all?

Mention this in the application

A relationship with God guarantees us access to someone who always cares about us. There is nothing that we can do or say to make God care about us less. We can open up to Him because He genuinely cares. He cares about our wants, needs, desires, hopes, dreams, successes, failures, etc. Our heavenly Father allows us to come to Him at all times with all of the things we have in our hearts. In those vulnerable moments, He is the shoulder to cry on and the ears that are listening. Prayer is how we speak with God. When we pray, God is listening. In Jesus' name, we can pray to our Heavenly Father and allow Him into the depths of our hearts. We don't have to hide. We don't have to sugar coat. We don't have to pretend that we are fine when we are not. God's word is clear that we can cast ALL of our cares on Him. There is nothing too small. People around us may count it as unimportant, but our Heavenly cares. As you go through your life, remember that your Heavenly Father cares all about you!

Prayer:

Ask God to help you spend more time in prayer.

Ask God to help you know what to pray for.

Thank God for Him making a way for you to talk with Him one on one.

FAITHFUL GOD

Scripture:

'Through the Lord 's mercies we are not consumed, Because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning; Great is Your faithfulness.'

Lamentations 3:22-23 NKJV

Observation:

What did you notice about the wording of this verse?

Did you notice the certainty of "not" and "they are"?

How do these words solidify the meaning of this verse?

Mention this in the application

Application:

Our Heavenly Father is always faithful to us. Faithfulness means being unconditionally committed to something, and our God IS committed to loving us! He is committed to granting us new mercies every day that He grants us breath. Mercy means holding off on treating someone how they deserve. We don't deserve God's love, but through His mercy, He gives it to us. We deserve death, shame, guilt, but because of His mercy, God frees us from those burdens. The verse says his compassions fail NOT. They won't fail, no matter what we do. God is waiting with open arms to give us mercy. Our job is to accept mercy and live like we are loved. We need to live like we are free from the penalties of sin in Jesus! Yes, we will have to deal with the consequences of our sinful ways, but we don't have to pay the ultimate price of sin, which is death (Romans 6:23). Each day you wake up and take a breath, do remember to receive the bouquet of mercies that are waiting just for you from... you know who!

Application:

This is a small excerpt from the story of Nehemiah. In Nehemiah's time, God called Nehemiah to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem, however, there were adversaries who were against God's people who did not want to see them flourish. Prior to Nehemiah's response in this verse, some rulers from other nations were trying to discourage Nehemiah and those building the wall with Him. Nehemiah's response is a lesson for us to live by today. This is the lesson from Nehemiah's response: when we do God's will, the enemy is going to send people or things to distract and discourage us from our task, but by obeying God, we will prosper. By following through on what God called us to do, we don't have to worry about what other people have to say. Nehemiah's answer also makes it clear that we are God's servants to do what He asks us to do. As servants of God, we can rest in the fact that God will empower us to do His will. It may seem impossible or even outright crazy to some, but with God, all things are possible (Matthew 19:26).

Prayer:

HOPEIN HIM

Scripture:

'Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, '

I Peter 1:3 NKJV

Observation:

Mention this in the application

Application:

God loves us so much that He made it His initiative to give us hope. Hope in the Bible means to have expectations for God to keep His word. We can hope in God for so many different things. The fundamental truths we can hope in God for are that He is who He says He is and that He will do what He says He will do. Through the resurrection of Jesus, God's commitment to carrying through with His word and mission was on display. God said He would make a way to save us from our sins, and that is exactly what He did through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Before Jesus died, He prophesied that the temple (His body) would be destroyed, but that He would raise it back up in three days (John 2:18-22). That is exactly what happened. Jesus died, but was raised to life in three days. Jesus beat death! Because of God the Father's power, Jesus was raised, and in Him we are raised too. We can have hope that all things are in God's hands. We can have hope that if God has the power to raise someone from the dead, then He has the power to be there with us during Hard times. We can have hope in God because He designed it that way. It is by the will of God that we are able to hope in Him. Our hope lives on because He lives!
